Dear Mr. Secretary:

On January 18, 1982, the Arizona Department of Water Resources (ADWR) sent to you the State's recommended allocations of supplies to non-Indian Central Arizona Project users. We would like to make the following revisions before action is taken on those recommendations:

1. Ranchlands Water Company. The last sentence in footnote No. 7 on Table I should be deleted. The footnote would then read, "It is recommended that during the contracting period the population projections for Pima County be reviewed to determine if new projections modify the distribution of population between the City of Tucson and Ranchlands Water Company."
2. Paradise Valley Water Company. There has been some confusion as to the actual boundary delineation between the Paradise Valley Water Company and the City of Phoenix service areas. The ADWR researched this problem and submitted a revised map to the Arizona Department of Economic Security, delineating new boundaries. These new boundaries are in compliance with information filed with the Arizona Corporation Commission, the agency responsible for regulation of private water companies. The Arizona Department of Economic Security provided the ADWR with population projections for the Paradise Valley Water Company based on these modified boundary delineations. The ADWR then revised the recommended allocation for Paradise Valley Water Company as follows:

	<u>Year 2034</u>
Previous Allocation	874 acre-feet
New Allocation	3,231 acre-feet

3. City of Phoenix. As a result of the adjustment to the Paradise Valley Water Company allocations, the City of Phoenix allocation should be reduced to 113,692 acre-feet.



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4. Maricopa-Stanfield Irrigation District. On Table No. 3, the 1985 percentage entitlement shown for the District is a typographical error and should be changed from 10.48 percent to 20.48 percent.
